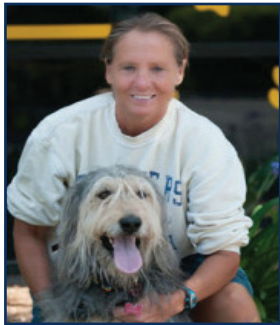

## From the Pack Leader



Summer is now here and we all know what that means...fleas, ticks and fireworks! All dogs that come to play at DogSpot are required to be on a flea preventative program. My own dogs are on Trifexis, which I highly recommend. For those of you who don't want to use chemicals in the war on fleas we sell a great product called "Flea the Scene" by Happy

Tails. It retails for \$13.99. Trifexis is a systemic so you only treat once a month. "Flea the Scene" is a spray so it is used as needed.

July 4th is right around the corner so I urge everyone to take precautions and make sure your dog is safe during firework celebrations. More pets go missing and end up shelters during this time of year than any other. Always keep your dog inside when fireworks are being let off.

Close all windows and doors, and block off dog doors to stop your dog from escaping and to keep noise to a minimum. Draw the curtains, and if the animals are used to the sounds of TV or radio, switch them on (but not too loudly) in order to block out some of the noise of the fireworks. If your dog is the kind that stresses over fireworks and isn't already crate trained you can prepare a 'den' for your dog where it can feel safe and comfortable – perhaps under a bed with some of your old clothes. Try not to cuddle and comfort a distressed dog, as they will think you are worried too, and this may make the problem worse. Instead stay relaxed, act normally and praise calm behavior. Avoid leaving your dog alone during such potentially upsetting events. If you can't be with your dog, your dog can always be with us! DogSpot is now offering 10 day and 20 day boarding packages, the boarding days can be used here and there, as you need them.
